CURRICULUM NEWS...

As we complete the 2021-2022 school year, we have shared in the return to in-person classes. As of this Spring, in addition to our regular sites, we now are holding classes in the Baldwin Wallace classrooms located in the Helwig Whistle Stop retail and office center at 599 W. Bagley Road. Being in these classrooms also provides the opportunity for us to dine at Jo Jo Carloni's or Perk Cup Café & Grille before or after classes.

In addition, we have added classes for sixteen new instructors to ILR. There are more opportunities for arts and crafts classes in basic drawing, watercolors, paper crafting and quilting. All in all, there were 114 classes held in the three Sessions.
